## Pause and Ponder

November/December – Jesus Heals an Invalid at Bethesda (John 5:1-15) Virtuous Action – Helping Others in Need

Today the Church remembers St. Nicholas, a bishop noted for generosity in his ministry. His kindnesses were done selflessly and privately. He became the inspiration for the person of Santa Claus.

How is St. Nicholas connected to this month's focus? Our miracle in this month's Gospel points to Jesus giving of self for another. The Gospel highlights the importance of listening – with one's ears, head, and heart – to the need of another and of responding to the fullest extent possible to that need. The Lord healed fully the man by the pool after listening to his need.

St. Nicholas, in his own way, did the same for people of his day. He listened and responded. And, to an extent, Santa Claus listens and responds (with a bit of help from parent elves) to what each child brings to his lap.

We are called to emulate St. Nicholas. This week, how can we listen attentively as does Santa Claus?

**Gaudete Sunday** – Next Sunday, December 15, marks the halfway point in Advent. It is called Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin root meaning to "rejoice." The readings of the day point to the coming of Jesus and the reign of God. The Church guides us to see that the advent of the Lord in history, mystery, and majesty (Bethlehem, Eucharist, and the end of time) is cause for rejoicing. Now is the time to begin decorating our schools and classrooms for Christmas.

#### **Action Required**

**Teacher Evaluation Committee** – In January a teacher evaluation committee will begin to meet. The committee will review and make recommendations of changes/additions to the current *Professional Standards for Catholic School Educators*. One specific change will be the inclusion of a student improvement standard and accompanying indicators. In addition, this committee will create a form principals will use in the spring of 2020 to provide feedback to educators in the area of student performance; for the current year, this feedback will not be a part of the teacher's summative evaluation. A revised summative evaluation form to include the student improvement component will be utilized in the 2020-2021 school year.

*Group Movie Licensing* – It is important for us to abide by copyright law when it comes to showing movies and educational films in groups settings in our facilities. Christ the Teacher Catholic School will again be coordinating the movie licensing this year. Christian Video Licensing International (CVLI) covers over 1,000 movie studios, including major studios such as: Disney, Pixar, Columbia, Sony, Warner Brothers, 20th Century Fox, Paramount, Universal, Dream Works, Scholastic, Lionsgate, The History Channel, and Discovery Channel along with the list found here:

Based on the enrollment of the schools which purchased a license last year, the licensing company quoted us *around* \$0.79 per student, if all of the same schools sign on.

**This year, the schools that were licensed last year will automatically renew.** If you are interested in removing yourself from the license or adding on to our group license, please e-mail Steve Adams, Assistant Principal at Christ the Teacher Catholic School, at <u>sadams@christtheteacher.org</u>, no later than *Monday*, *January 6*. Enrollment numbers will be based on the numbers provided in the annual report provided by the diocese. If you need to change your total enrollment number, please also contact Steve no later than January 6<sup>th</sup>. Invoices will be provided to schools in February. Once payment is received, the copy of the license will be forwarded to the school.

#### **Attention Needed**

**Student & Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP)** – If international students will be travelling out of the country during the Christmas break, be sure they have their <u>original</u> I-20 signed by Dr. De Angelo before **Wednesday**, **December 18**.

**BOOST Assessments (Maryland Schools**) – Schools participating in the BOOST program and receiving tuition assistance funding are reminded that they **must** adhere to the assessment requirements.

- English/Language Arts and Mathematics assessments each year for students in Grades 3-8 and at least once for students in Grades 9-12; and
- A Science assessment at least once for students in Grades 3-5, at least once for students in Grades 6-9, and at least once for students in Grades 10-12.

These assessments must be taken from the list of assessments published by the United States Department of Education to qualify nonpublic schools for the National Blue Ribbon Schools Program. Administering the approved assessments is required in the 2019-2020 school year and each year thereafter by the annual Budget Bill enacted by the Maryland General Assembly.

The attached School Enrollment Report (11/30/2029) shows that, although our overall retention in parish, regional, and diocesan schools has dropped in the last two months by 12 students since the Official Enrollment Report of September 30, recruitment in schools has stemmed what could have been a greater decline. Let's keep working together for both recruitment and retention. We'll all be stronger in the end.
