Pause and Ponder

October – Jesus Heals an Official's Son at Capernaum in Galilee (John 4:46-54) Virtuous Action – Asking for Assistance

This month our virtuous action was *Asking for Assistance* and our role model was the official who sought healing for his son. Whenever we ask for assistance, there is always an element of risk. While we admire the faith of the official and celebrate with him the healing of his son, the situation could have had different results.

Sometimes, in asking for assistance, one of three things may occur. Like the official, our request may be granted just as desired. At other times, our request may not occur at all and we may become discouraged. Somewhere between these polar opposites lies the third option. The third option is that our request receives a reply, but not exactly the response we thought would occur.

It is in this third option that true faith is tested. Here, a response might occur but not be understood or accepted. We are challenged to believe that what the Lord sends our way was meant for us.

This week let us be open to what comes our way, particularly as a result of prayer. Let us accept that in asking for assistance, we may receive not what we desire, but what we need.

Catholic Identity

All Souls Day (November 2) — "I believe... in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting." — These final words of the Apostles Creed gain our focus in November, the Month of the Holy Souls. We learn from the Catechism of the Catholic Church that faith in the resurrection of our bodies is inseparable from our faith in the Resurrection of Christ's body from the dead. He rose as our head, as the pattern of our rising, and as the life-giving source of our new life. All the dead will rise when Jesus comes again to judge the living and the dead. In the final resurrection, our bodies will be transformed, although we do not know precisely how. The manner of our resurrection exceeds our understanding and imagination and is accessible only by our faith.

From the Human Resources Office...


