#### Pause and Ponder

October – Jesus Heals an Official's Son at Capernaum in Galilee (John 4:46-54) Virtuous Action – Asking for Assistance


In his book, *Give and Take*, Adam Grant, a professor at the University of Pennsylvania, writes about the differences between givers and takers. Without expending much time on these differences, I would suggest that most of us in Catholic education are givers. While this characteristic is admirable, it sometimes creates in us a sense of self-reliance in that we choose not to ask others for assistance.

In the miracle of Jesus healing the official's son, we learn about the need to ask for assistance. We can assume that the official was probably most competent in what he did in his work, had oversight of others, and earned respect from his subordinates. Yet, none of these attributes would prove helpful in healing his son. It is when the official recognized that his need required assistance from another, in this case from the Lord, that he was able to find what he needed.

Our virtuous action for October is to acknowledge our need for others – to ask for assistance. Let's reflect this week on whom we can rely for assistance and express our gratitude to them for what they do for us.
