Pause and Ponder

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will called children of God.

We are knowledgeable of the theological virtues (faith, hope, and love) and familiar with the cardinal virtues (temperance, prudence, fortitude, and justice). However, what might be called a premier virtue flows from the seventh Beatitude. That virtue is joy.

Joy fills us and those around us when we experience the peace that is understood from the seventh Beatitude. The Diocese of Wilmington has announced an upcoming major spiritual event, the Eucharistic Congress, scheduled for October 5, 2024, at the Ocean City Convention Center in Ocean City, Maryland. This pivotal event, themed "The Eucharist: Source and Summit," aims to deepen the faith and fellowship among the Catholic community across Delaware and the Eastern Shore of Maryland.

The Congress will feature a keynote address from Bishop Richard Henning of the Diocese of Providence, who will share his insights on the pivotal role of the Eucharist in Catholic life and worship. Attendees will have the opportunity to engage in praise and worship, participate in Eucharistic Adoration, and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The event will also host faith-based vendors and feature a ministry fair showcasing the various diocesan ministries that serve our community, providing attendees with opportunities to learn more about and engage with these vital efforts.

New Teacher Orientation Day - August 14

Please be sure to distribute the attached letter to **teachers new to the Diocese of Wilmington**, even if they have taught elsewhere prior to joining your school. New Teacher Orientation Day, Wednesday, August 14, is a requirement for all teachers hired to work in parish and diocesan Catholic schools in the diocese. Private Catholic schools are encouraged to have their teachers participate in this orientation day.

A number of important topics will be addressed throughout the orientation day including the role and responsibilities of a Catholic school teacher, requirements for fulfilling Initial Faith Formation, licensing and certification, and the diocesan mentoring program. Also, the day will provide conversation with colleagues and a good start to networking in the Catholic schools of the Diocese of Wilmington.

International Students

I-20 Signatures for Returning Students – International students returning home for the summer who intend to return to CDOW schools in September will require the Superintendent's signature on their I-20 documents to permit the students to re-enter the United States. The Superintendent's signature must be on the <u>original</u> I-20 that has been signed by the students and the student's parents. Requests for the Superintendent's signature should be received by *Friday, May 17*.

I-20 College Transfers – Students planning to transfer from a CDOW high school to college will need their I-20 documents transferred. The receiving college generally provides a form requesting the transfer. The form should be forwarded to Dr. De Angelo by *Friday, May 17*. Please contact Dr. De Angelo with any questions or concerns about this process.
