Pause and Ponder

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.

Sunday, December 3, begins the new liturgical year with the season of Advent. During these weeks leading to Christmas, we have the opportunity to see meekness in action in the events of the Christmas narrative.

In the Gospel of Saint Luke proclaimed at Christmas, we hear about the birth of Jesus. We are told that "there were shepherds in that region living in the fields and keeping the night watch over their flock" (Lk 2:8). To these shepherds the angels came to announce the birth of the Savior.

These shepherds are the meek about which the third Beatitude speaks. They are found fulfilling their daily responsibility without much attention from others. They were probably simple-living people doing a day's work, albeit a 24-hour day living among the sheep.

It was to these meek that the great gift of Christmas was given. The shepherds were the first people to see the newborn king. They would be blessed and "inherit the land" of salvation by their humble homage of the Christ Child.

This week, let us meditate on the shepherds gazing upon the Lord, reminding us of the hope of salvation that lies before us.

Catholic Identity – Blessed Are You Among Women

The Second Vatican Council reminds us that Mary is a member of the Church who "occupies a place in the Church which is higher after Christ and also closest to us." She is the first and the greatest of all the disciples of Christ.

An essential part of God's plan for the mother of his Son was that she be conceived free from Original Sin. In anticipation that she was to bear the Son of God, Mary was preserved from the time of her conception from Original Sin. We call this the Immaculate Conception. The Immaculate Conception does not refer to the virginal conception and birth of Christ, but rather to Mary's being conceived without inheriting Original Sin.

In the course of time, the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception became more precisely enunciated. In 1854, Pope Pius IX proclaimed this dogma infallibly: that is, in his role as the supreme teacher of the Church, he declared that this doctrine is divinely revealed and must be accepted with faith by the entire Church.

The Immaculate Conception of Mary is celebrated each year on December 8.
