Catholic Identity - Catholic School Leaders


In the first week of January we celebrate two giants in Catholic school education – St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and St. John Neumann. Both saints changed the face of Catholic school education in our nation.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (January 4) was the first person born in what would become the United States to be canonized by the Catholic Church (1975). She established the first Catholic girls' school in the nation in Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she also founded the first American congregation of religious sisters, the Sisters of Charity.

St. John Neumann (January 5) immigrated to the United States in 1836, where he was ordained, later joined the Redemptorist order, and became the fourth Bishop of Philadelphia (1852–1860). He is the first United States bishop (and to date the only male U.S. citizen) to be canonized. While Bishop of Philadelphia, Neumann founded the first Catholic diocesan school system in the United States. He was canonized in 1977.

Following the morning meeting, administrators will celebrate the Christmas season with a luncheon sponsored by the Catholic Principals' Organization (CPO).



Group Movie Licensing Renewal Deadline - January 12

It is important for us to abide by copyright law when it comes to showing movies and educational films in group settings in our facilities. Christ the Teacher Catholic School will again be coordinating the movie licensing this year. Christian Video Licensing International (CVLI) covers over 1,000 movie studios, including major studios such as: Disney, Pixar, Sony, Warner Brothers, 20th Century Fox, Paramount, along with the list found here: http://cvli.com/producers/total-package/. The license also covers streaming services when a teacher streams from their own account to a class, as long as the producer is found in the list linked above. (Netflix, Hulu, etc.)

Based on the enrollment of the schools which purchased a license last year, the licensing company quoted us around \$0.80 per student, if all of the same schools sign on. *This year, the schools who were licensed last year will automatically renew*. If you are interested in removing yourself from the license or adding on to our group license, please e-mail Tina Gallagher at Christ the Teacher Catholic School at tgallagher@christtheteacher.org, no later than *Friday, January 12*. Invoices will be sent to schools in February. Last year 19 schools participated which had an enrollment of 5,803 students bringing the cost to \$.71 per student.

Professional Development Day Survey Deadline - January 12

The PD Day Planning Committee has been meeting since early November to work on the details of our March 11 diocesan-wide PD Day. The theme for the day will be **AI and Technology: The Future is Now.** The committee is seeking feedback from educators throughout the diocese to ensure that the presentations on PD Day will meet the needs of teachers from Pre-K through Grade 12. School administrators are asked to share the link below with all teachers and request that the survey be completed by **Friday, January 12** (prior to the next meeting of the committee). If there is a faculty meeting at your school between now and mid-January, perhaps teachers could be given a few minutes to complete the survey during the meeting; this may allow the committee to get more responses than just sending the link to faculty members.
