Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

As we continue our Lenten journey, we are called to transformation, as posited in the Gospel account of the Transfiguration. The three privileged Apostles – Peter, James, and John – returned as different people from the mountain top following the miraculous transfiguration experience of Jesus. Surely, they were changed for life by this event.

Through the experience of mercy – given and received – we, too, become different people. Each occasion in which we either extend mercy to another or receive mercy from another impacts us deeply so that we are no longer the person we once were. True mercy is transformative in building the Kingdom of God among us.

While our mercy encounters are not as dramatic as the Transfiguration experience, they are, in fact, opportunities to see the face of Christ in others. The face of one who gives or receives mercy is illuminated by what Pope Francis calls "the joy of the Gospel."

During this upcoming week, if someone is in need of your mercy or if you are waiting for the mercy of another, go find your brother or sister. Allow yourself to give and receive the "joy of the Gospel" through a reconciliation with another person.

<u>Baptism</u>

- 1. The Sacraments of Christian Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.
- 2. Baptism gives a person birth into new life. It is necessary for salvation and for entry into the Church.
- 3. Baptism seals the person's soul with a permanent spiritual mark or character identifying one as belonging to Christ. Because of this character, Baptism cannot be repeated.

Black History Month – February

February is a time to focus on Black Catholics. Here is a "Did You Know?" provided by Brenda Burns, Director of the Office for Black Catholics, Diocese of Wilmington.

Did you know that a delegation of Black Catholics from the Wilmington Diocese was present at the Sixth National Black Catholic Congress (NBCC) to hear Servant of God Sister Thea Bowman? Sister Thea Bowman is one of the six African Americans in the process of being canonized a Saint and spoke an inspiring message on that occasion at Catholic University in Washington, D.C. in 1987. The first Black Catholic Congress was held in 1889 and convenes every 5 years. This past year in 2023 the NBCC was held at the Inner Harbor in Maryland and a delegation of 28 people represented the Diocese of Wilmington.

Principal Position – Good Shepherd Catholic School

The position of Principal of Good Shepherd Catholic School with a start date of July 1, 2024 will be posted on Monday, February 26.

In accordance with Policy 4120 and the Principal Search Process for a Parish School, current diocesan principals are notified of the vacancy by the Superintendent. If a current principal is interested in being considered for a transfer he/she must contact the Superintendent within ten days of the notification. At the same time, he/she must inform his/her current Pastor of the request. (If applicable, the principal must also notify the President/Board Chair.) Upon receiving the transfer request, the Superintendent will notify the hiring Pastor and a determination of one of the following will be made:

- An interview will be granted to the current diocesan principal with the hiring Pastor; if a transfer is deemed acceptable and agreed upon, the Principal Search Process is concluded.
- The current principal will be invited to participate in the full Principal Search Process with other candidates and will be granted an interview with the Principal Search Committee.

A current principal who applies for the vacancy after ten days, but before the deadline, will be interviewed with other candidates as part of the full search process.
