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## Catholic Identity – Lent 2024



Ash Wednesday will begin the season of Lent on February 14. Schools are encouraged to create a school-wide plan for this liturgical season, communicate it to faculty and staff in advance so they are well- prepared, and educate families about it throughout Lent so they are informed and involved. Some items you may wish to consider include:

- ✓ Theme Is there a unified theme that will be present throughout the classrooms and school that reflects the primary message of Lent prayer, fasting, almsgiving?
- ✓ Image Is there a single image (photo, artwork, etc.) which will be visible in the classrooms and throughout the school connected to the theme?
- ✓ Prayer How will the school community pray together daily or weekly? Will Stations of the Cross hold a prominent place in school prayer?
- ✓ Service Will a particular service activity be planned to expand students' understanding and action of fasting and almsgiving?

If we expect students to understand and appreciate Lent at all grade levels, then the preparation for Lent must be intentional in our Catholic schools.

## Vision for the Future Tuition Assistance Deadline – January 31 Final Month to Apply for 2024-2025

Applications and all required documentation for the 2024-2025 school year must be received by FACTS no later than *January 31, 2024*. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered.

Schools are asked to recommend that all student families apply for tuition assistance. This enables the Development Office to meet emergency needs that may arise during a school year. Often, a family will reach out to the Development Office when their circumstances change. The Development Office may only assist families if they have applied previously to FACTS.

2022 W2 statements are accepted. A family does not need to wait for the 2023 W2 statement.

Tuition assistance through the Diocese of Wilmington is provided to children attending Grades K-12.

Families currently receiving tuition assistance from the diocese must reapply. Assistance is not automatically renewed from year to year.

Award notifications will begin as of March 1, 2024.
