Catholic Identity - National Eucharistic Revival

Appropriately we begin the new school year this month with a focus on the Eucharist – "the source and summit of the Christian life (CCC 1324-1327)." The prayer intention of Pope Francis for July is Eucharist-centered. "If you are the same at the end of Mass as you were at the beginning, something is wrong," the Pope said in a video message released July 3 for his prayer intention for the month of July: "For a Eucharistic life."

School Mass with Bishop Koenig

The schedule for school Mass with Bishop Koenig is again provided for your reference along with the revised liturgy planning sheet. Please follow the directions in returning the sheet to Mrs. Therese Rubini, Secretary to the Bishop, and Rev. Michael Preston, Director of the Office for Worship, at least 14 days prior to the event. If there are any questions or concerns from either Fr. Preston or the Bishop's Office, your adherence to the return deadline allows time for responses.

All school liturgies should be well-planned and Mass with Bishop Koenig is no different. Student and staff familiarity with responses and music, well-trained servers and lectors, a sense of reverence in receiving the Eucharist, appropriate attire – all of these elements contribute to the dignity and solemnity of the celebration of Mass.

Teachers New to Your School 2023-2024

New Teacher Report – For each new teacher, counselor, and nurse newly hired to your school, a <u>New Teacher Report</u> and a copy of the educator's resume is to be submitted immediately upon hire to Mary Filippone, Personnel Coordinator. Educators whose New Teacher Reports are received by *Thursday, August 10*, will be included in the New Teacher Orientation on Thursday, August 17.

Hiring Teachers from Other Catholic Schools – In accordance with Policy 114 of the Catholic Schools Office School Personnel Handbook, presidents/principals may interview an administrator or a teacher from another Catholic school, if the candidate meets the minimum criteria for the open position. An offer of employment may <u>not</u> be made without engaging in a conversation with the candidate's current administrator. This conversation must include a documented reference check on the candidate.

At no time is the school administrator, or designee, permitted to solicit an employee from another Catholic school.

After August 1, school administrators may <u>not</u> consider hiring an administrator/teacher who has signed an agreement of employment with, or made a commitment to, another Catholic school.

New Teacher Orientation – All teachers, counselors, and nurses new to the Diocese of Wilmington, or returning after a gap in employment of five or more years, hired by Thursday, August 10, are to attend the New Teacher Orientation held *Thursday, August 17*, at **Christ the Teacher Catholic School**, **2451 Frazer Road**, **Newark**, **DE 19702**, beginning at **9:00 am**. Please be sure new employees are aware of this information. Additional information will be communicated to new employees by email based upon the data submitted in the New Teacher Report.

Employment Postings – IMPORTANT – In order to maintain the integrity of the employment posting page, please notify Mary Filippone as soon as a position has been filled so that the posting may be removed. It is very important this time of year that the postings reflected on the diocesan website are accurate and not outdated.

Students New to Your School 2023-2024

Student Immunizations – You are reminded that all students seeking admission to your school are <u>required</u> to have appropriate immunizations. This requirement is a health and safety issue for the entire school community. The COVID vaccine is **not** a required immunization.

There are two types of exemptions to immunization requirements – medical and religious – permitted in Delaware and Maryland. If a family provides documentation for a medical exemption to immunization, please review it with your school nurse before an exemption is granted. There is **no religious exemption** for students attending a Catholic school since immunizations are not in conflict with Church teaching. In addition, there is **no parental request exemption** available in Catholic schools. It is important that all schools adhere to this diocesan policy (#5110).

Be sure your school's application for admission includes the requirement for documentation of immunization and the notation that a student is accepted **conditionally** until the documentation is provided.

Conditional Acceptance – Parents of students new to your school should understand that their children are accepted conditionally for the first trimester (elementary school) or first quarter (high school). This conditional acceptance allows both the family and the school to determine if the placement is correct.

Enrollment Reports – On **Friday, July 14, July 28, and August 18**, parish and diocesan schools will be asked to submit an enrollment report for 2023-2024. The enrollment report should list the numbers of students who are registered for 2023-2024 by completing all the steps in the process your school requires and by submitting a registration fee.

All schools – parish, diocesan, and private – submit a *first day count* at the start of the new school year and an official enrollment count on *Friday, September 29*.

Teacher Professional Development Week

Teacher Professional Development Week offers the opportunity to begin the new school year in a positive way. Besides Spirituality Day (August 23) which brings together more than 500 colleagues for the celebration of Mass, the recognition of service years, and a message to begin the new school year, the other four days provide time for important work at your school. Each day should begin with the faculty and staff joining together for prayer, a way of emphasizing our collective Catholic identity. Other topics that may be addressed over the course of the four days include, but are not limited to...

- the diocesan theme and its planned development in the classroom and throughout the school by prayer, instruction, and service;
- the importance of the regularly-scheduled liturgies for the school year and appropriate preparation for them;
- expectations regarding lesson planning, instruction, assessment, and teacher supervision
- Renaissance assessment and the planned use of data
- a review of the school handbook and reference to the CSO School Personnel Handbook
- school safety procedures
- communication protocols with families
- new Teacher Evaluation process

In addition to these topics and others dealing with faith development, academic excellence, and school practices, reminding faculty and staff about the mission of Catholic education and spending time sharing the culture of your school are critically important to the start and continuance of a good school year. Thank you for using these professional development days productively.

As you plan for your August faculty days, remember that for educators to receive clock hours for school-based professional development, pre-approval from the CSO is needed. Use the <u>Professional Development Pre-Approval Form</u> which can be completed electronically and sent to Carol Ripken for approval. If you have a signed pre-approval form, you may generate the clock hour certificates at your school using the <u>Professional Development Certificate Template</u>.

Renaissance - myON

As we study Renaissance data, we've learned a few things. First, a minimum goal in Reading and Math is for students to grow at least one year in learning each year, as measured by Renaissance data. Second, Math scores across schools tend to demonstrate greater learning than Reading scores. Third, the use of Freckle Math has improved scores in schools in which it is used consistently. Fourth, meeting cut scores for Blue Ribbon has not been successful since COVID and cut scores have not been adjusted.

Renaissance - myON (continued)

As educators, we know a few things. First, consistent attention to a particular subject improves results. Second, the way to become a better reader is to read. Third, to create change in schools, we need to hold teaching and learning to a standard that we check regularly.

To these ends, last year we engaged Renaissance in a pilot study of myOn across all elementary schools. (Some schools were already myOn users with good results.) Feedback was very positive among consistent users. We now have the opportunity to acquire myON for our students at the reduced rate of \$13.00 per student for Grades K-8 for September 1 through August 31, if we purchase as a district of schools. While this purchase may be out of cycle with regard to the school budget, it may be a great benefit, if utilized by teachers, in supporting student learning. One way to finance this acquisition may be through the home-school association.

Please inform Dr. De Angelo by Friday, July 21, of your school's interest (yes or no) in a diocesan initiative to acquire myON for the 2023-2024 school year. myON can be purchased with EANS or Title funds.
