#### Pause and Ponder

Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.

The March Beatitude invites us to intentionality.

Those who seek to be clean of heart or pure desire only one thing, namely, heaven where they will see God. All thoughts, words, and deeds are directed to this aim and the motivation never wavers.

Of course, we live in a world of distractions that interrupts, obstructs, or even blinds this desire in our lives. We may find ourselves often swimming upstream simply to keep our focus.

What did Jesus do to maintain his attention to the mission he accepted? He prayed and prayed and prayed. Throughout the Gospels we find selections where he went off by himself to pray. We also find selections where he invited others to pray with him. All four Gospels record moments of prayer in the life of Christ.

As we seek to be clean or pure of heart, we must cleanse ourselves of busyness, work, events, or activities, at least for a time each day, to develop the single focus of our relationship with the Lord. As we continue to build this relationship, we shall truly find that we see God in our world and in one another, the precursor to seeing God face to face in heaven.

#### Confirmation

- 1. The reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace.

- 3. The Holy Spirit bestows seven gifts wisdom, understanding, knowledge, fortitude, counsel, piety, and fear of the Lord to assist us in our mission and witness.


