#### Pause and Ponder

Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.

Coronary artery disease starts when fats, cholesterols, and other substances collect on the inner walls of the heart arteries. This is called atherosclerosis. The buildup is called plaque. Plaque can cause the arteries to narrow, blocking blood flow. The plaque can also burst, leading to a blood clot.

The physical buildup of plaque in the heart mirrors what sin does to the soul. As stated in the Confiteor, I have at times "...greatly sinned in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done, and in what I have failed to do; through my fault..." These choices affect my relationships with God and others. They narrow pathways in my life, blocking the flow of grace in my life. Serious disruptions may even totally burst relationships that have existed.

However, just as one would seek medical attention and remedies for atherosclerosis, the same exists for the soul. On Monday, March 25, 3:00-8:00 pm, the physician of our soul – Jesus – is available to offer us a remedy in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation in every church in the Diocese of Wilmington. Plan for yourself and invite others to come to the Divine Healer and receive this Sacrament. Lent is indeed the time for us to realize, "Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God."

#### Anointing of the Sick

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- 1. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is for those who are seriously ill or in danger of death or suffering the difficulties of old age.
- 2. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be administered each time the believer falls seriously ill or an illness worsens.
- 3. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is a liturgical and communal celebration, whether it takes place in a family home, a hospital or church, for a single sick person or a whole group of sick persons.

Each school may choose to administer the assessment to students in 2<sup>nd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grades, as well as to all teachers, between the dates of March 18 – May 3. 
Results from the ARK assessment serve multiple purposes. They inform administrators and teachers about students' knowledge and practices / beliefs regarding the faith. This information assists in curriculum planning and student instruction. Results also provide teachers with areas for their personal growth in the faith. Administrators learn about topics that may form the basis of ongoing faith formation for the faculty through inservice opportunities or for families through school communications. Bishop Koenig and the Catholic Schools Office obtain a diocesan profile of faith among the schools.

Each school administrator should schedule now for the date on which ARK will be administered at their school so that a last-minute rush does not occur.

# Women's History Month - March

Women's History Month is an excellent time to talk with students about gender stereotypes and bias, hail important women in history, discover more about women's issues and their fight for equity, read literature that celebrates women and girls, analyze sexism, and explore its causes and solutions. As with other similarly themed months, it is important not to isolate the exploration of women's history and culture into one month during the year. Women's history is U.S. history and should be integrated into the curriculum throughout the school year.

# School Safety Workshops

The US Secret Service National Threat Assessment Center (NTAC) is sponsoring a series of two-hour online workshops on ways to enhance school safety using the behavioral threat and risk assessment model. This is the model we used in Delaware as we originally designed the Model School Safety Protocols. NTAC does a great job of providing timely, data driven and actionable concepts for detecting and responding to different preattack behaviors as well as self-harm indicators. Each session begins at noon and ends at 2:00pm, the dates are May 8<sup>th</sup> and July 11<sup>th</sup>. I believe each is the same with several opportunities to attend, but will verify.
