Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.

Love, joy, peace, patience, etc. are virtues to which we all strive in some way. It is not unusual to tell others that we seek to be more loving toward others, joy-filled in our work, peaceful in conflicts, and patient in trying circumstances. We reflect on our behaviors around these virtues and acknowledge success when we move closer to the virtue we hope to display.

Our Beatitude virtue for November is humility. But humility is unlike the other virtues described. It seems odd or uncomfortable to tell others that we are striving to be humble. It almost sounds as if we are bragging about how humble we are or can be.

Humility seems to be a virtue that develops by simply being our best self in the circumstances where we are. It finds fulfillment in being genuine in beliefs, moral in character, and honest in situations. Humility seems to spring forth from the life of God (grace) that is in each one us.

A humble person need not tell others that s/he is seeking to be humble. It becomes obvious to others because, to paraphrase St. Francis de Sales, the humble person is who s/he is and is that well.

Catholic Identity – End of the Liturgical Year

The liturgical year concludes with the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe on **Sunday**, **November 26**. Created by Pope Pius XI in 1925, it is a reminder of our place in the reign of God – at the service of our Lord. This liturgical occasion should be included in classroom instruction in schools to highlight the solemnity and to identify the conclusion of another liturgical year cycle. Consider prayer and song appropriate to this solemnity during the week of November 26.

The kingdoms of this world at times are sustained by arrogance, rivalries and oppression; the reign of Christ is a 'kingdom of justice, love and peace.' For a Christian, speaking of power and strength means referring to the power of the Cross, and the strength of Jesus' love: a love which remains steadfast and complete, even when faced with rejection, and it is shown as the fulfillment of a life expended in the total surrender of oneself for the benefit of humanity.
