

Second Chances

October is the Month of Second Chances. As we conclude September this week and mark the end of the first full month of the 2023-2024 school year, October offers teachers and students the opportunity to begin again. What worked well in teaching and learning in September and should be continued? What classroom procedures, learning strategies, or teacher or student attitudes need to be tweaked so that they will work better in October? What teacher or student behaviors or ideas should be discarded completely? Pay attention during this last week of September so that through metacognitive reflection you may discover answers to these questions. Remember... success builds on strengths and failure occurs only when we refuse to learn from our errors.

As you look at your classroom environment, consider the following items in each category below.

- Managing Classroom Procedures
 - O Do you manage instructional groups to maximize learning and time on task?
 - o How do you create smooth transitions between classes and among activities in a lesson?
 - o Are classroom materials and supplies readily available to and easily obtainable by students?
 - o Do students understand what to do regarding non-instructional time?
- Managing Student Behavior
 - o Are student expectations brief, clearly outlined, and understood by students?
 - o Is student behavior actively monitored at all times?
 - Are consequences for misbehavior understood by students and applied consistently?
- Creating a Culture for Learning
 - o Does an appropriate rapport exist between teacher and students?
 - Does everyone understand that the business of school is learning?
 - o Is content appropriate to the students?
 - Are the expectations for learning and achievement explained, posted, and reviewed daily?
 - o Are students encouraged to take pride in their work?
- Organizing Physical Space
 - o Is the classroom safe?
 - o Is the classroom orderly?
 - o Is the classroom a welcoming place to be?

These questions may be productive as part of either large- or small-group discussions in schools so that there is a common understanding for your school.



Why do we celebrate National Hispanic Heritage Month?

As we kick off National Hispanic Heritage Month, it's important to understand *why* we dedicate a month to honoring the histories and cultures of Hispanics in the U.S. This week, we're spotlighting a **2-minute video** from PBS Learning Media that answers this question.

The video is short and accessible for students at all grade levels, so you can easily incorporate it into a lesson for the upcoming week. Begin by playing the video for your students, then follow up with the question at the end of the video, "What famous person of Hispanic or Latino descent would you like to meet?

It also establishes our place among the 195 dioceses with schools in the United States.
